



## Your support does a lot!

## “THEIR EYES WERE OPENED, AND THEY RECOGNIZED HIM.”

After the resurrection, two disciples in Emmaus recognized Jesus in the stranger who broke bread with them. Their eyes were suddenly opened through the act of sharing.

In this year’s Easter Vigil readings, Baruch tells us where to find life and peace. Too often we look in the wrong places. But when we shift our focus to the stranger, “there is light for the eyes” and we recognize the risen Christ. If we turn to the stranger, to those who are poor and marginalized, as Jesus did in his earthly ministry, our eyes are opened and we find life and peace.

### HONDURAS Strengthening of Civil Society

Radio Progreso and ERIC (Reflection, Investigation and Communications Team) are Jesuit projects that accompany marginalized communities affected by injustice and violence in Honduras.

CJI supports their solidarity work. The Strengthening of Civil Society program opens people’s eyes to human rights violations and enables marginalized people to come together and see a way forward to peace.

CJI’s 2019 target for this program: \$169,375.

### DARJEELING, INDIA Jesu Ashram

Jesu Ashram is a health centre and home for the destitute in India. It was founded by Canadian Jesuit Robert Mittelholtz in 1971. Today Jesu Ashram cares for 3000 in-patients and 7000 outpatients every year. It also provides a home to 150 long-term patients.

Jesu Ashram sees the dignity of people who are invisible to mainstream society and supports their right to health care.

CJI’s 2019 target for Jesu Ashram: \$186,917.
