
Thanks to your wonderful support and participation, Canadian Jesuit International's "Bridging Borders" campaign for Giving Tuesday was a great success!

Campaign Results

- Raised awareness by engaging 1, 452 students from the elementary level through to university across Canada.
- Organized 30 public and private events in the following cities: Ottawa, Montreal, Toronto, Winnipeg, Regina, Calgary, Edmonton, Lethbridge and Vancouver.
- Amplified the message through media such as Salt and Light (TV), The Catholic Register and the B.C. Catholic (Print), Voces Latinas (Spanish radio) and The Agenda with Steve Paikin (TV Ontario).
- Raised \$135,849 for 3 projects 35% over our goal!
